- Develop learning partnerships with families/whānau in order to make learning journeys visible and understood and supported.
- Work collaboratively with your team to understand and enact a localised curriculum as underpinned by the goals and outcomes of Te Whāriki
- Ensure that children's learning progression is supported through effective assessment planning and evaluation and teaching strategies that include Te Whāriki goals and learning outcomes.
- Ensure the learning environment is safe and reflects children's interests and learning and development priorities.
- Engage with the rituals of the Professional Growth Cycle to enhance your professional knowledge and capability.
